As part of our larger “End of Summer Celebration” held on August 24, 2024 Faith created a unique and fantastic “Choose Your Own Adventure” for our library families to enjoy.

To begin, our young adventurers were asked to choose a character from a Wizard, a King or Queen, or a Knight with each choice supplying its own twist to the tale.

Each page of the adventure was posted at a different location throughout the library so players had to physically move through and search out the pages of their choice. Along the way you were introduced to trolls, fairies, and gnomes but also could encounter more sinister creatures like giant spiders!

After making your way through a series of choices you were met with a final challenge to perform a Feat of Strength, a Feat of Smarts, a Feat of Magic, or a Feat of Charm that involved dice rolling against a librarian and another activity ranging from lifting and carrying a bag of beans, sword fighting a “librarian”, talking about your favorite book or story, or solving a riddle!
