Library Programs of the Year

2009 Awards, Presented on May 17, 2010 by the Southern Adirondack Library System at its 52nd Annual Meeting

Crandall Public Library for *The Reduced Shakespeare Company—Even Further Abridged*: The program was a dramatic production by the Crandall Public Library teen group. The teens produced a highly creative, fully staged production of a farce which summarized all of Shakespeare's work. This project helped teens develop research skills, an in-depth knowledge of Shakespeare, teambuilding, professional theater skills, develop a greater sense of community involvement and an increased awareness of the new Teen Center and the library services available. New community partnerships were forged, the teen population in the community was cast in a more positive light, and relationships between library staff and teens were formed and improved.

Galway Public Library for Story Sculptures: This program was a series of drawing, writing, and painting workshops inspired by local history. Youths under the age of 18 were encouraged to work together in a series of library workshops and public events to create 26 free standing wood sculptures to answer "Who Visits and Drinks from the Galway Cast Iron Watering Trough?" Youths listened to local historians Tom Cwialka and Ray Davis discuss the trough's history, illustrated their ideas, transferred their drawings to plywood, and painted their sculptures. At an "artists reception", the youths were available to share their art and experiences, and enhanced the overall community pride. Local artist Benno Kollegger also assisted the youths in the project.

TAKING STOCK: Minimum Standards

Regulations of the Commissioner of Education

Regulation 90.2: Standards for Registration of Public, Free Association and Indian Libraries

- (a) A public, free association or Indian library will be registered if it meets the following standards satisfactory to the commissioner:
- (1) is governed by written bylaws which outline the responsibilities and procedures of the library board of trustees;
- (2) has a board-approved, written long-range plan of service;
- (3) presents an annual report to the community on the library's progress in meeting its goals and objectives;
- (4) has board-approved written policies for the operation of the library;
- (5) presents annually to appropriate funding agencies a written budget which would enable the library to meet or exceed these standards and to carry out its long-range plan of service;
- (6) periodically evaluates the effectiveness of the library's collection and services in meeting community needs;
- (7) is open the following scheduled hours (see chart)
- (8) maintains a facility to meet community needs, including adequate space, lighting, shelving, seating, and restroom;
- (9) has a telephone, photocopier, microcomputer, printer, telefacsimile machine and other equipment necessary to facilitate access to information;
- (10) distributes printed information listing the library's hours open, borrowing rules, services, location and phone number.
- (11) employs a paid director in accordance with the provisions of Section 90.8 of this Part (see chart)
- (b) Any public, free association or Indian library registered by the department at the time this section takes effect shall be required to meet the standards for registration in subdivision (a) of this section on the following schedule:
- (1) meet the standards of paragraphs (1) through (5) and (10) of subdivision (a) of this section on or before January 1, 1995.

- (2) meet the standards of paragraph (6) of subdivision (a) of this section on or before January 1, 1997.
- (3) meet the standards of paragraphs (7), (8), (9) and (11) of subdivision (a) of this section on or before January 1, 1999.
- (c) Variances. If circumstances over which any public, free association or Indian library has no control prevent it from meeting one or more of the standards of service set forward in subdivision (a) of this section, such library may apply for a variance for such standard(s). The application for such variance shall be submitted for such library by the public library system of which such library is a member, in a form prescribed by the commissioner. No variance granted pursuant to this subdivision shall be deemed to relieve a public, free association or Indian library of any obligation imposed by any other provision of federal or state law.



Federal Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) Grants (FY2008-2010)

Continuing Education for Library Managers (\$7,365 in 2009) This project was to provide continuing educational workshops in April 2009 and September 2009 designed for library management staff. The objective was to give the attendees skills and knowledge needed in order to operate their libraries effectively to meet local community needs. The Southern Adirondack Library System (SALS) worked with the Public Library Association (PLA) and the Adirondack Community College (ACC) to provide two CPLA courses, Strategic HR: Organization & Personnel Management and Planning and Maintaining Library Buildings.

Jeanne Goodrich presented Strategic HR on April 29-30, 2009. Cheryl Bryan presented Planning and Maintaining Library Buildings on September 16-17, 2009. A total of eighty-one people attended the programs.

Summer Reading Program (\$6,000 in 2009)

This program provides libraries a grant of \$176 each for programs and materials to support their Summer Reading Programs

Gates Library Grant Initiative; Opportunity Online Hardware Grant Program

This program is designed to help public libraries upgrade hardware and learn how to sustain these upgrades over time. The program focuses on libraries that serve high need communities that are struggling to keep pace with technology changes. The program also seeks to motivate local governments to commit long-term local funding to computer services in public libraries. Amount disbursed: \$17,649

SALS Undesignated State Aid

CPLA Scholarship

For costs related to attending two CPLA Workshops each library was eligible to have one paid attendee. Amount disbursed: \$8,500

Continuing Education and Travel

One grant for \$325 per year for attendance at professional meetings and workshops and mileage to attend them. Amount disbursed: \$3,208

Program of the Year Awards

To acknowledge exemplary services, award-winning libraries receive \$200 each. Awards were given to Corinth Free Library for the program *Living on the Edge* and Mechanicville District Public Library for *Mechanicville Losers*. Amount disbursed: \$400

Trustee of the Year Awards

To acknowledge exemplary services by Trustees of Member Libraries. Libraries receive \$200 each. Awards were made in honor of: Richard "Dick" Merrill---from the Crandall Public Library and Thomas Mellon---from Stillwater Free Library. Amount disbursed \$400



We are proud to have been the SALS Central Library since 1958. During 2009, Crandall Public Library continued to experience increased use of Central Library services. This continuing success could not have been accomplished without the guidance and support of the Southern Adirondack Library System, its Board of Trustees, Director, Sara Dallas and staff. We also extend our appreciation to the trustees of Crandall Public Library and the trustees of SALS who approve the Central Library Plan of Service each year. Implementation of the Central Library Plan of Service would also not be possible without the dedication of Crandall staff, and the 34 member libraries that use the services of the Central Library.

As recipients of Central Library services, member libraries and their customers provide assessment of the effectiveness of our services and their reactions inform the Central Library program. A May 2009 internet survey indicated that 93% of regional respondents accessed Crandall Public Library resources remotely through the library's website (www.crandalllibrary.org) and used these resources for education, health information, eGovernment and employment. Crandall Public Library also participated in NYLA's SnapShotNY, a one-day glimpse at library services. One Central Library customer stated:

"Crandall Library is my resource for books, audiobooks, magazines, reference. I love the "new" library. I am so glad to have such a wonderful facility to borrow from and to have so many choices in what I borrow. Knowledge and information are so important to me and what better place to get that than at the library."

With the bulk of the expansion and renovation project completed, Crandall Public Library programs and services continued to expand in 2009 at seemingly exponential rates. For example:

- Provided 34,069 items for Central Library Interlibrary loan including the popular pocket-sized Playways (digital audiobooks). This represents a 15.6 % increase over 2008.
- Even the smallest libraries in the SALS system may be asked by a customer for very complex material from any location in the world. Central Library staff place requests for the member libraries for these materials through OCLC's interlibrary loan function. The materials are sent directly to the requesting library to get the items to the requestor as quickly as possible, and the borrowing library assumes the responsibility for mailing the materials back to the loaning library.
- With CBA funds, purchased a start-up collection of e-books; 80 non-fiction titles were purchased. In the first month there were 139 check-outs. To help expand the service, the Round Lake Library and Round Lake/Malta branch generously contributed 9 fiction e-books this month.
- Continued to add to Crandall's in-depth adult, non-fiction collections to supplement services to the 30.6% of Crandall customers who are Central Library patrons.
 Central library staff is always willing to share their expertise with member libraries and provide training in special collections and resources such as health and genealogy.
